ORDINANCE NO. ~~161~~ 161

AN ORDINANCE repealing Ordinance No. 89 and providing for a franchise fee for transitory businesses in the amusement and exhibition field.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF REDMOND, WASHINGTON, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That Ordinance No. 89 of the Town of Redmond, Washington is hereby repealed, effective October 1, 1952.

Section 2. That all businesses in the field of entertainment or exhibition for profit, whether operated by individuals, corporations, partnerships or otherwise, desiring to do business in the Town of Redmond, Washington are henceforth required to obtain from the Clerk of the Town of Redmond, Washington, a permit to do such business, and upon application therefore shall pay to the said Clerk as a franchise fee the sum and amount of \$10⁰⁰^{per concession}A, for each day on which it is intended to do such business.

Section 3. That this Ordinance shall have no application to regularly established business in the Town of Redmond, and shall apply only to transitory or temporary businesses for profit.
