ORDINANCE NO. 168


AN ORDINANCE relating to the removal of filth and source thereof, and the removal of filth or other cause of sickness on private property, and providing penalties.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF REDMOND, WASHINGTON, as follows:

Section 1. The Health Officer of the Town of Redmond shall remove, at the expense of the Town, all filth found therein, which in his judgment endangers the lives or health of any inhabitants, and require the owner or occupant, when he thinks necessary, to remove or discontinue any drain or other source of filth.

Section 2. When any source of filth, or other cause of sickness is found on private property, the owner or occupant thereof shall, within twenty-four hours after notice from the Health Officer of the Town of Redmond, at the expense of said owner or occupant, remove or discontinue it; and if he neglects or unreasonably delays to do so, he shall forfeit to the Town of Redmond the sum of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00), and the said Health Officer shall cause the nuisance to be removed or discontinued, and all expenses shall be repaid to the Town by the owner, occupant or the person who caused or permitted it. Said sum of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) and expenses shall be recoverable by the Town in a civil action instituted against the owner, occupant or the person who caused or permitted said nuisance to exist.
