BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF REDMOND AS FOLLOWS

WHEREAS, the owners of certain below described real property located at Redmond, King County, Washington did petition the Town Council of the Town of Redmond, Washington, for zoning of the said real property to C-1, and

WHEREAS, upon receipt of said petition, the Town Council did thereupon designate June 13, 1956, at 8 00 o'clock P M. at the Town Hall, Redmond, Washington as the time and place for public hearing of protests on said petition, and did thereupon cause to be posted and published and mailed to each interested property owner a notice of hearing, all in accordance with the requirement of Ordinance No. 172 of the Town of Redmond, Washington, and

IT IS ORDAINED AND ORDERED, that the following described real property is hereby zoned C-1, situated in King County, Washington, and described as follows

That portion of the southwest quarter of the northeast quarter of Section 11, Township 25 North, Range 5 East, W M., lying southeasterly of State Aid Road No 56, also known as W. W. Easter Road, lying northeasterly of Secondary State Highway No 2-D, also known as West Lake Sammamish Boulevard and lying southwesterly of the Sammamish River, also known as King County Drainage District No. 3, EXCEPT the south 150 feet thereof

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED. That this Ordinance shall take effect from and after its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor, and after its legal publication as required by law, and shall thereafter be in full force and effect.

PASSED by the Town Council of Redmond, Washington and approved by the Mayor on the 13th day of June, 1956.
