## ORDINANCE NO. 191

AN ORDINANCE relating to persons convicted of certain crimes; requiring registration with the Marshal; making certain records confidential; defining offenses and prescribing penalties.

THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF REDMOND DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: DEFINITIONS: As employed herein, the term "felon" shall mean and include any person convicted of a felony, or any person convicted of any crime which would constitute a felony under the laws of the State of Washington.

section 2: REGISTRATION REQUIRED: Any felon who shall be reside, or come within the Town of Redmond, on or after the effective date of this act, whether in transit through the town or otherwise, shall report to the Marshal of the Town of Redmond within forty-eight (48) hours after such effective date, or arrival therein, and shall furnish to said Marshal a written statement signed by such person; containing the following information:

(1) His true name and all aliases which he has used or

under which he may have been known;
(2) A full and complete description of his person;
(3) The kind, character and nature of each crime of

which he has been convicted;

(4) The place where such crime was, or crimes were, committed and the place of conviction of the same;

(5) The name under which he was convicted in each

instance and the date thereof;

(6) The name, if any, and the location of each prison, reformatory, jail or other penal institution in which he was confined or to which he was sentenced;

(7) The location and address of his actual or intended residence, stopping place, living quarters or place of abode in the Town of Redmond; if he has more than one residence, stopping place of abode that he fact must be staffed stopping place, or place of abode that fact must be stated and the location and address of each place given;

(8) A statement of the kind of residence, stopping place or place of abode in which he resides or intends to stop, whether the same is temporary or permanent, to-wit; whether the same is a private residence, hotel, apartment house, or other building or structure;

(9) The length of time he has occupied each such place

of residence, stopping place or place of abode, and the length of time he expects to or intends to remain within

the town; and (10) Such other information as the Marshal shall find reasonably necessary to carry out the intent of this section.

Section 3: CHANGE OF ADDRESS: Any such person changing his place of residence, stopping place or abode, shall, within forty-eight (48) hours thereafter notify said Marshal in a written and signed statement of such change of address, together with the address thereof and the information required in sub-sections 8 and 9 of Section 1 above.

Section 4: PHOTOGRAPHS AND FINGERPRINTS: At the time of furnishing such information as required above, such person shall be photographed and fingerprinted by the Marshal, which photos and fingerprints shall become a part of the permanent record of 30 the Town of Redmond.

Section 5: FALSE INFORMATION: It shall be unlawful for any felon to furnish in such report any false or fictitious address

or any address or intended address other than a true address or intended address or to furnishi in making any such report, any false, untrue, or misleading information or statement relating to any information required by any provision of this ordinance to be made or furnished.

Section 6: RECORDS CONFIDENTIAL: The statements, reports, records, photographs and fingerprints taken pursuant to this ordinance shall be the private records of the Marshal of the Town of Redmond, open to inspection only by the town police officers or persons having official duties to perform in connection therewith; and it shall be unlawful for anyone having access to such discharge of his duties, any information contained therein, except as authorized in the following section.

Section 7: REPORTS AVAILABLE TO POLICE OFFICIALS: The Marshal shall have the authority to transmit information taken from such records to the head of any organized police department of any state, county or municipality of the United States when written request therefor is made and received from such head of such other police department stating that such information is in the investigation of such law enforcement office or agency and further stating that such information will not be used for any other purpose.

Section 8: EXCEPTIONS: The requirements of this ordinance shall not apply to any person who has received a full pardon for each crime whereof he shall have been convicted, nor to any crime for the conviction of which such person has obtained a final release or discharge from a reformatory, penitentiary or other penal institution more than five (5) years prior to the effective date of this ordinance, or the entrance of such person within the Town of Redmond thereafter, nor shall the provisions of this ordinance while in custodia legis.

Section 9: PENALTIES: Anyone who shall violate or fail to comply with any provision of this ordinance, shall upon conviction thereof be punished by a fine in any sum not exceeding One Hundred not exceeding thirty (30) days, or both such fine and imprisonment. Each separate day or portion thereof during which any to constitute a separate violation hereof and a separate offense provided.

Section 10: This ordinance shall take effect and be in force five (5) days from and after its passage, approval and legal publication.
