

ORDINANCE NO. 239

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR EMERGENCY EXPENDITURES FOR THE COST OF DEFENSE OF A TOWN POLICE OFFICER IN LITIGATION WHICH AROSE OUT OF THE DISCHARGE OF HIS DUTIES.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF REDMOND, WASHINGTON:

WHEREAS, Sergeant Jerry Houser during the course of the discharge of his official duties as a police officer of the town of Redmond became involved in a situation which subsequently led to litigation wherein Sergeant Jerry Houser is defendant and William F. Meenach is plaintiff, and

WHEREAS, the town council of the town of Redmond has made a finding that it is in the best interest of the town of Redmond and in the best interest of public safety that the said Sergeant Jerry Houser have competent council to defend him in the said litigation, and

WHEREAS, the estimated cost of defense of the said Sergeant Jerry Houser will be two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500.00) and

WHEREAS, an emergency exists as a result of the said litigation which could not reasonably have been foreseen at the time of making the annual estimates for the year 1960,
NOW THEREFORE

IT IS ORDAINED AND ORDERED that emergency warrants shall be issued to cover the expense above mentioned to the extent of two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500.00), and that said emergency warrants shall be paid from any money on hand in the town treasury in the fund properly chargeable with the above mentioned expenditure.

PASSED by the unanimous vote of the town council of the town of Redmond, Washington and approved by the Mayor on the 13 day of APRIL, 1960.
