

## Town of Redmond Ordinance No. 254

AN ORDINANCE prohibiting the discharge of firearms in the Town of Redmond except by permit; fixing permit fees; providing penalties for violations; and repealing Ordinance No. 78.

Whereas, the indiscriminate discharge of firearms within the limits of the Town of Redmond presents a constant source of danger to the bodily well being and comfort of persons within said Town, and

Whereas, it is deemed necessary in the interest of public safety that the discharge of firearms within the Town of Redmond be prohibited except by permit, Now,

Therefore

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF REDMOND:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to discharge any firearm within the Town of Redmond, or to hunt game birds or animals with a loaded weapon except on premises or property for which a permit has been issued by the Town Council at a regular meeting thereof. Such permit shall be granted only to a property owner and shall define the area and period of time covered thereby. The Town Council may deny the issuance of a permit and may impose conditions at its discretion. The fee for such permit shall be the sum of \$1.00.

Sec. 2. This Ordinance shall not prohibit peace officers or military personnel from discharging firearms in the performance of their official duty.

Sec. 3. Any person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in an amount not exceeding \$100.00 or by imprisonment in jail not exceeding 30 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Sec. 4. Ordinance No. 78 is hereby repealed.
