

ORDINANCE NO. 333

AN ORDINANCE, relating to membership on the City Planning Commission, and amending Ordinance No. 240.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 1 of Ordinance No. 240, approved April 13, 1960, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 1. Pursuant to the authority conferred by Chapter 44 of the Session Laws of 1935 of the State of Washington and Chapter 35.63 RCW, there is hereby created a City Planning Commission, consisting of seven (7) members who shall be appointed by the Mayor, subject to confirmation by a majority vote of the City Council, all of whom shall be residents of the City of Redmond at the time of their appointment and during their tenure of office."

Section 2. Section 2 of Ordinance No. 240, approved April 13, 1960, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 2. The term of office of each of the seven commission members shall be for a period of six (6) years, commencing on April 1 of even numbered years and ending on March 31 six years thereafter and the terms shall be so staggered that three commission members are appointed for one six year tenure; two commission members are appointed for another six year tenure; and two commission members are appointed for another six year tenure; Provided, that the first appointments shall be made as follows:

Three members shall be appointed for six (6) year terms, to commence April 1, 1964 and end on March 31, 1970;

Two members shall be appointed for four (4) year terms, to commence April 1, 1964 and end on March 31, 1968;

Two members shall be appointed for two (2) year terms, to commence April 1, 1964 and end on March 31, 1966.


In making the first appointments, the Mayor shall designate the term for which each commission member is appointed. Thereafter, appointments shall be made for six (6) year terms upon the expiration of the terms of the first appointees in the manner herein stated.

Vacancies occurring otherwise than through the expiration of terms shall be filled for the unexpired terms. Members may be removed, after public hearing, by the Mayor, with the approval of the City Council, for inefficiency, neglect of duty or malfeasance in office. The members shall be selected without respect to political affiliations and they shall serve without compensation.

Section 3. This Ordinance shall take effect on March 25, 1964.


