ORDINANCE NO. 345

AN ORDINANCE, adopting the budget for the City of Redmond, Washington for the year of 1965, making appropriations for estimated expenditures, and fixing the amount of taxes to be levied.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Budget for the City of Redmond for the year 1965, as approved on the 5th day of October, 1964, after due notice of hearing and after the preliminary budget was duly filed with the City Clerk as required by law, is hereby adopted in the aggregate total sum of \$670,716.50.

Section 2. There is hereby appropriated from estimated revenues, including available surplus, revenues from taxation and revenues from all other sources, the following amounts for expenditures in each of the following classes during the budget year of 1965, as follows:

Section 3. There is hereby levied upon all taxable property, both real and personal, within the City of Redmond, Washington for general taxation purposes and voted excess levies for general obligation bond issues, a tax levy for the year 1965 as follows:

Section 4. Copies of the detailed and itemized Budget adopted for the year 1965 shall be kept on file at the office of the City Clerk and shall be available for inspection.

Section 5. This Ordinance shall be in force and take effect five days from and after its passage, approval and publication as required by law.
