

ORDINANCE NO. 380

AN ORDINANCE, relating to water service and amending Ordinance No. 207, fixing rates and charges for water service in the Viewpoint Area; rates and charges for sprinkler standby service and fire hydrant use; and establishing regulations for irrigation, sprinkling and recreational water consumption.

WHEREAS, a portion of the City, comprised mainly of the territory annexed to the City under Ordinance No. 331, is served by water purchased under an Agreement the City made with King County Water District No. 81 and is served through facilities separate from other parts of the municipal water system, which were installed as a part of the Viewpoint Water System under Project No. 01-W-65; and

WHEREAS, the cost of the water purchased for such water system and the costs of constructing the Viewpoint Water System require that different rates and charges for water service be established for users of this water system than those in effect for users of the previously existing municipal water system;

NOW, THEREFORE,

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Ordinance No. 207 is hereby amended by the addition of the following new section:

"Section 2.5 For the purpose of fixing rates and charges for the furnishing of water by the City of Redmond within that portion of the City served by the Viewpoint Water System, installed under Project No. 01-W-65, and any additions to and extensions to such system, the City Council hereby establishes the following monthly rates, based upon metered water consumption:

INSIDE THE CITY LIMITS

Basic Rates - For all service except as noted below.

0 - 700 cubic feet	-	\$3.50 minimum per month
Next 2800 cubic feet	-	.30 per hundred cubic feet
Next 3500 cubic feet	-	.25 per hundred cubic feet
All Over 7000 cubic feet	-	.20 per hundred cubic feet

Multiple Units

Duplexes: Duplexes shall have separate meters for each unit and rates shall be the same as basic rates.

Apartments, Motels & Trailer Courts:

- First Unit - 700 cubic feet/\$3.50 Minimum
- Each Additional Unit - 500 cubic feet/\$3.00 Minimum

The minimum monthly charge shall be the sum of the minimum charges based on the number of individual units. For water consumption in excess of the minimum, the basic rate above shall apply to such excess consumption.

Irrigation, Sprinkling & Recreation - Services 2" & over.

- 0 - 3500 cubic feet - \$10.00 minimum
- All Over 3500 cubic feet - \$.20 per hundred cubic feet

OUTSIDE THE CITY LIMITS

Outside the corporate limits of the City of Redmond, the above rates shall apply, plus a surcharge of 25% thereof."

Section 2. Ordinance No. 207 is hereby amended by the addition of the following new section:

"Section 2.6 The following rates are hereby established for the water services below listed, served by any part of the municipal water system of the City:

- a. Sprinkler Standby Service. The following monthly rates are hereby established for all sprinkler standby service. The size of the service shall be determined by the size of the service connection from the main to the property line.

- 2" - \$ 2.00 per month
- 3" - 3.00 per month
- 4" - 4.00 per month
- 6" - 6.00 per month
- 8" - 8.00 per month
- 10" - 10.00 per month
- over 10" - By agreement.

- b. Fire Hydrant Use. No water for any purpose other than fire fighting shall be taken from any City fire hydrant without first obtaining permission from the City Water Department. Applications for temporary water use from fire hydrants shall be made to the Water Department in writing and on forms provided by the City. A charge of \$5.00 per permit will be collected at the time the permit is issued to cover the cost of metering. A minimum charge of \$1.00 per day shall apply to all fire hydrant permits."

Section 3. Ordinance No. 207 is hereby amended by the addition of the following new section:

"Section 7.5 Irrigation, Sprinkling and Recreational Water Consumption. Services for irrigation, sprinkling and recreational usage shall be subject to the following regulations.

1. The City Water Department may restrict the above uses to certain hours of the day and/or certain days of the week.
2. The City Water Department may limit the maximum amount of water to be consumed over a specified period of time.
3. The installation of check valves, slow closing valves, vacuum breakers, and other appurtenances necessary for the protection of the City's water system may be required by the City Water Department.

The City shall not be liable for damages or losses resulting from the curtailment of water usage under the above regulations. However, wherever practicable, the City Water Department will endeavor to give reasonable advance notice to the public or the persons concerned of restrictions or limitations on the use of water for such purposes. Any person violating any of the above regulations, after notice by the City Water Department of requirements thereunder, shall be guilty of a violation of this ordinance.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force five (5) days after the date of its publication, in the manner provided by law.
