

ORDINANCE NO. 385

AN ORDINANCE, adopting the Budget for the City of Redmond for the year 1966; making appropriations for estimated expenditures; and fixing the amount of taxes to be levied.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Budget adoption. The Budget for the City of Redmond for the year 1966 is hereby approved and adopted in the aggregate total sum of \$600,474. as determined and filed with the City Clerk.

Section 2. Appropriations. There is hereby appropriated from estimated revenues, including available surplus, revenues from taxation, and revenues from all other sources, the following amounts for expenditures in each of the following classes for the budget year 1966, as follows:

(1) Salaries and Wages	\$151,020
(2) Maintenance and Operation	201,984
(3) Capital Outlay	159,889
(4) Interest and Debt Redemption	87,581
(5) Expenditures from Proposed Bond Issues	<u>None</u>
TOTAL APPROPRIATIONS	<u>\$600,474</u>


Section 3. Taxes levied. There is hereby levied upon all taxable property both real and personal, within the City of Redmond, Washington, for general taxation purposes and voted excess levies for general obligation bond issues, a tax levy for the year 1966 as follows:

General Tax Levy	15	mills
Excess Tax Levy: Redmond Limits 1	1.214	mills
Redmond Limits 3	.687	mills


Section 4. Copies of Budget. Copies of the detailed and itemized Budget adopted for the year 1966 shall be kept on file at the office of the City Clerk and shall be available for inspection by any interested person.

Section 5. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force five (5) days after the date of its publication in the manner required by law.

PASSED by the City Council of the City of Redmond, Washington, at a regular meeting thereof, and APPROVED by the Mayor this 4th day of October, 1965.
