ORDINANCE NO. 417

AN ORDINANCE, relating to and regulating motor vehicles, traffic, travel and transportation and their incidents upon the public streets and ways open to travel within the City of Redmond; amending Ordinance No. 304 by the addition of sections thereto; and repealing Ordinance No. 387.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Ordinance No. 304, effective June 1, 1963, is hereby amended by the addition of the following section:

Sec. 127. Statutes adopted by reference. The following statutes of the State of Washington are hereby adopted by reference thereto and made a part of this ordinance. Three copies of said statutes shall be kept on file with the City Clerk.

<u>Section 2</u>. Ordinance No. 304, effective June 1, 1963, is hereby amended by the addition of the following section:

Sec. 90.1. All day parking. No person shall park or stand any vehicle upon any street or public way for a period exceeding twenty-four (24) hours, regardless of any other regulation then in effect. When any vehicle is so parked or stands for a period exceeding twenty-four (24) hours, such vehicle shall be deemed to constitute a hazard or obstruction to traffic or an abandoned vehicle and may be impounded as provided in Section 120.

Section 3. The penalties provided in Section 112 of Ordinance No. 304 shall apply to violations of the sections added by this ordinance unless a different penalty is prescribed therein.

Ordinance No. 387, adopted October 26, 1965, is hereby Section 4. repealed.

Section 5. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force five (5) days after the date of its publication in the manner provided by law.
