CITY OF REDMOND, WASHINGTON

ORDINANCE NO. 456

AN ORDINANCE, vacating all streets, alleys and public ways in the Plat of the Town of York, within the City of Redmond, Washington.

WHEREAS, a written Petition for the Vacation of Street, signed by in excess of two-thirds of the property owners abutting thereon, was filed with the City Clerk and presented to the City Council; and

WHEREAS, the City Council, by Resolution No. 195, set the date of February 13, 1968, at 8:00 P.M., at the City Hall, before the City Council, as the time, place and authority for a public hearing to be held on said Petition; and

WHEREAS, due and proper notice of such hearing has been made in accordance with law; and

WHEREAS, the hearing having been duly held, there being no objections by any of the abutting property owners, and the City Council having determined that it is in the best interest of the City and the property owners concerned that such street and public way be vacated, NOW, THEREFORE

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> That the Petition be granted, and the following described street and public way is hereby declared vacated:

All streets, alleys and public ways dedicated in the Plat of the Town of York, recorded in volume 4 of Plats, page 64, records of King County, Washington.

Situated in the City of Redmond, King County, Washington.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force five (5) days after the date of its publication in the manner provided by law.
