

CITY OF REDMOND, WASHINGTON

ORDINANCE NO. 457

AN ORDINANCE, relating to and regulating motor vehicles, traffic, travel and transportation and their incidents upon the public streets and ways open to travel within the City of Redmond; amending Ordinance 304.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 126 of Ordinance No. 304, effective June 1, 1963, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 126. Statutes adopted by reference. The following statutes of the State of Washington are hereby adopted by reference thereto and made a part of this ordinance as though fully set forth herein. Three copies of said statutes shall be kept on file with the City Clerk.

Section 2. Ordinance No. 304, effective June 1, 1963, is hereby amended by the addition of the following section:

Sec. 127.5 Ways open to the public - Definition. "Ways open to the public" and "ways open to public travel" shall mean and include any road, alley, lane, parking area, or any place, private or otherwise, adapted to and fitted for travel by motor vehicles, that is in common use by the public with the consent, expressed or implied, of the owner or owners, and further, any public playgrounds, school grounds, recreation grounds, parks, parkways, park drives, park paths, and wharves, station grounds, public facilities and rights of way open to the use of the general public.

Section 3. Ordinance No. 304, effective June 1, 1963, is hereby amended by the addition of the following section:

Sec. 127.6. Traffic jurisdiction & violations upon ways open to the public. It shall be unlawful for any person:

- (a) who is under the influence of or affected by the use of intoxicating liquor or of any narcotic drug to drive or be in actual physical control of any vehicle, as defined and set forth in Secs. 60 & 61, Ch. 155, Laws of 1965 (Ex. Session) (RCW 46.61.505) (adopted by reference by Ord. 417);
- (b) to drive or operate any vehicle in a reckless manner so as to constitute reckless driving, as defined and set forth in Sec. 67, Ch. 32, Laws of 1967 (RCW 46.61.500) (adopted by reference by Ord. 457);
- (c) to drive or operate any vehicle in a negligent manner, as defined and set forth in Sec. 69, Ch. 32, Laws of 1967 (RCW 46.61.525) (adopted by reference by Ord. 457); or
- (d) to leave the scene of an accident without complying with the requirements for leaving information and rendering assistance as required and set forth in RCW 46.52.010 (adopted by reference by Ord. 457) and Sec. 53, Ch. 32, Laws of 1967 (RCW 46.52.020) (adopted by reference by Ord. 457);

upon ways open to the public or ways open to public travel. The City Police Department and its officers shall have jurisdiction and authority to enforce the provisions of this section, to make investigations regarding violations thereof, and to investigate accidents occurring upon ways open to the public and to public travel, and shall have the authority to impound vehicles pursuant to Section 120, Ordinance 304, upon ways open to the public, which constitute a hazard or an obstruction to traffic or where the owner is unknown or circumstances indicate the vehicle should be impounded for safe-keeping or where the owner of the property requests the vehicle be removed from the premises.


Section 4. Ordinance No. 304, effective June 1, 1963, is hereby amended by the addition of the following section:

Sec. 127.7. Ways open to the public - Declaration of purpose. It is hereby declared necessary for the protection of property and the public health, safety and welfare to extend the police power and enforcement of traffic to ways open to the public.


Section 5. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force five (5) days after the date of its publication in the manner provided by law.
