ordinance no. 5/4/3

AN ORDINANCE, relating to the Board of Park Commissioners; and amending Sections 2.16.010 and 2.16.020 of the Redmond Municipal Code to increase the membership thereof.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 2.16.010 of the Redmond Municipal Code and

Section 1 of Ordinance No. 386 are hereby amended to read as follows:

"2.16.010 Established--Qualifications of members. A board of park commissioners is hereby created and established within the city. It shall consist of five members, who shall be appointed by the mayor, subject to confirmation by a majority vote of the city council, all of whom shall be residents of the city of Redmond at the time of their appointment and during their tenure of office. Appointments shall be made from citizens of recognized fitness for the position and shall be selected without respect to political affiliations, race or sex. Members shall serve without salary or other compensation, except that they may be reimbursed from park department funds for necessary expenses actually incurred. The board of park commissioners may be known as the Redmond Park Board."

Section 2. Section 2.16.020 of the Redmond Municipal Code and Section 2 of Ordinance No. 386 are hereby amended to read as follows:

"2.16.020 Term of office--Vacancies--Removal. The members of the board of park commissioners shall hold office for a term of three years, commencing on the first day of January. The three existing commissioners shall continue to serve for the balance of their respective terms; and the two additional commissioners authorized by this amendment shall be appointed for the balance of 1970 and shall begin two and three year terms respectively (as determined by the mayor) beginning January 1, 1971. Thereafter, as each term expires, appointments shall be made for a three year term. Vacancies occuring otherwise than through the expiration of a term shall be filled for the unexpired term by appointment of the mayor as provided in Section 2.16.010. Members may be removed, after a public hearing, by the mayor with the approval of the city council, for inefficiency, neglect of duty, malfeasance in office, or incapacity."

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
