

CITY OF REDMOND, WASHINGTON

ORDINANCE NO. 546

AN ORDINANCE, establishing salaries and wages for officials and employees of the City of Redmond for the calendar year 1971, and thereafter until amended, modified or repealed; and repealing Ordinance No. 510.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Salaries and wages established. A salaries and wages scale for the respective offices, departments and positions of the officials and employees of the City of Redmond is hereby adopted and established for the calendar year 1971, and thereafter until amended, modified or rescinded, in accordance with the "City of Redmond Salary and Wage Schedule," which is attached to and made a part of this ordinance.

Section 2. Determination of actual compensation to be paid. Where a range is shown for a particular salary or wage, the appointing authority or department head shall have the authority and discretion to determine the actual salary or wage to be paid within the range and position indicated, based upon experience, ability, performance and other qualifications for the position; provided the gross salaries do not exceed the budgeted amount for the department. Each department head shall determine whether compensatory leave or pay shall be allowed for overtime work in accordance with section 2.02.070 of the Redmond Municipal Code, which may exceed the salary or wage for the position but shall not exceed the gross amount budgeted for the department.

Section 3. Certification of payroll. The appointing authority and department heads shall certify to the city clerk and Personnel Officer the salaries and wages to be paid to officials and employees under their jurisdiction pursuant to this ordinance,


giving the name of the recipient, the title, office or position held, and the salary or wage established; provided, that the salaries and wages of personnel under civil service shall also be approved by the Civil Service Commission pursuant to state law.

Section 4. Repeal. Ordinance No. 510, passed December 16, 1969, is hereby repealed.

Section 5. Effective date. This ordinance shall take effect on January 1, 1971, and the salaries and wages scale herein established shall take effect and be in force as of that date.

PASSED by the Council of the City of Redmond, Washington at a regular meeting thereof, and APPROVED by the Mayor this 15th day of December, 1970.


