CITY OF REDMOND, WASHINGTON ORDINANCE NO. 574

AN ORDINANCE, declaring an emergency exists in the operation of the waterworks utility, requiring the expenditure of an estimated amount of \$9,400.00 for the restoration and repair of Well No. 1; such expenditure and repair to be made immediately and without notice or hearing pursuant to RCW 35A.33.080.

which requires the expenditure of an estimated amount of \$9,400.00 for the restoration of such facility to a condition of usefulness and to protect and preserve the public water supply and system from further deteroriation; and that such expenditure and repair should be made immediately for the protection of the public health, welfare and safety without further notice or hearing pursuant to the provisions of RCW 35A.33.080 and the general laws applicable to non-charter code cities. Public Works Director to proceed immediately. The Director of Public Works is authorized and directed to prepare the necessary plans and specifications, order the necessary materials and supplies, and to proceed to accomplish the necessary work by city employees and equipment on force account immediately without further notice or hearing. Section 3. Effective date. This ordinance is hereby found and declared to be a public emergency ordinance necessary for the protection of the public welfare, credit and property of the City of Redmond and shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval as provided by

RCW 35A.12.130.
