

CITY OF REDMOND, WASHINGTON

ORDINANCE NO. 612

AN ORDINANCE, creating a Citizen Advisory Committee for Shoreline Management, providing for the appointment for members thereto, describing the purpose of the committee and setting forth its duties and responsibilities.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Creation of Citizen Advisory Committee for Shoreline Management. In order to maximize the involvement of the general public in the formulation of a master plan to regulate the use of shorelines within the City of Redmond pursuant to RCW Chapter 90.58, a Citizen Advisory Committee for Shoreline Management is hereby created, consisting of 15 members who shall be appointed by majority vote of the Planning Commission and shall be residents and/or property owners within the Redmond planning area.

Section 2. Appointment of members -- tenure -- vacancies. The Planning Department staff shall develop criteria to guide the selection of members of the Advisory Committee so that those appointed may be representative of the various interests within the Redmond planning area and meet the objective of broad citizen involvement as set forth and required by the Shoreline Management Act Final Guidelines for implementation. (WAC Chapter 173-16) Members of city government and interested citizens are encouraged to submit names for nomination. The Planning Commission shall appoint members to the Advisory Committee by majority vote at an open public meeting from nominations made by any Commission member from among a list to be submitted by the Planning Department. Members appointed shall serve until concurrence has been reached upon the adoption of a master plan for shoreline management as provided by WAC 173-16-040(1). Vacancies occurring shall be filled by appointment by the Planning Commission in the same manner as for original appointments.


Section 3. Purpose of Advisory Committee. The purpose and function of the Citizen Advisory Committee for Shoreline Management will be to guide the formulation of a master program to provide an objective basis for regulating the use of shorelines within the Redmond planning area and to utilize as much citizen input as possible in accordance with WAC 173-16-040.

Section 4. Organization and work of Advisory Committee. Upon their appointment, the Advisory Committee shall organize and may elect a chairman, vice chairman and other officers as may be appropriate and may determine rules and procedures for their meetings. The Advisory Committee, with the assistance of the Planning Department staff, shall make the studies, hold public meetings and public hearings as are outlined in the suggested approach to citizen involvement in the development of a master program for shoreline management contained in WAC 173-16-040 (1) and shall have the duties and exercise the functions as therein set forth. The Advisory Committee should utilize citizen involvement by appointment of sub-committees from time to time as the need arises. Upon completion of this work, the Advisory Committee shall recommend a master program to the Planning Commission to be studied by the Commission and recommended, in turn, to the City Council for adoption of the necessary and appropriate policy statements.

Section 5. Effective date. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force five (5) days after the date of its publication in the manner provided by law.

PASSED by the Council of the City of Redmond, Washington, at a regular meeting thereof, and APPROVED by the Mayor this 20 day of February, 1973.


