

CITY OF REDMOND, WASHINGTON

ORDINANCE NO. 614

AN ORDINANCE, vacating a portion of unimproved 188th Avenue N.E., within the City of Redmond, Washington.

WHEREAS, a written Petition for the Vacation of Street, signed by in excess of two-thirds of the property owners abutting thereon, was filed with the City Clerk and presented to the City Council; and

WHEREAS, the City Council by Resolution No. 311 set the date of March 6, 1973, at 8:00 P.M., at the City Hall, before the City Council, as the time, place and authority for a public hearing to be held on said Petition; and

WHEREAS, due and proper notice of such hearing has been made in accordance with law; and

WHEREAS, the hearing having been duly held, there being no objections by any of the abutting property owners, and the City Council having determined that it is in the best interest of the City and the property owners concerned that such street and public way be vacated, NOW, THEREFORE,

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the Petition be granted, and the following described street and public way is hereby declared vacated:

The following portion of 188th Avenue N.E.:

The west 30 feet of the property herein described, as conveyed to King County by deed recorded under auditor's file No. 1495917, volume 1135, page 354 of Deeds:


The north 170 feet of the west 330 feet of the southwest quarter of the southeast quarter of section 6, township 25 north, range 6 east, W.M.

Situate in the City of Redmond, King County, Washington.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force five (5) days after the date of its publication in the manner provided by law.

PASSED by the Council of the City of Redmond, Washington at a regular meeting thereof, and APPROVED by the Mayor this 20 day of March, 1973.
