

CITY OF REDMOND, WASHINGTON

ORDINANCE NO. 677

AN ORDINANCE, providing for the fluoridation of the public water supply of the City of Redmond and providing for the installation of necessary facilities and equipment for such purpose.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Redmond submitted to the registered voters of the City an advisory ballot proposition regarding the fluoridation of the public water supply of the City of Redmond, and the voters of the City at the general election held on November 5, 1974, voted in favor of the fluoridation of the City public water supply and system; and

WHEREAS, the City Council held a public hearing on January 20, 1975, to consider the question of fluoridation of the City water supply and system and heard testimony from persons speaking in favor and in opposition to the fluoridation of the City's public water supply; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds and has determined that the fluoridation of the public water supply of the City of Redmond will preserve and promote the public health, welfare and safety and is in the public interest of the citizens of Redmond, Now, Therefore,

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Fluoridation of water supply authorized and directed. The City Council of the City of Redmond hereby authorizes and directs that a source of fluoridation approved by the State Department of Health shall be added to the public water supply and system of the City of Redmond under the rules and regulations of the Washington State Board of Health, such addition to be administered and controlled in a manner approved by the Washington State Department of Health and the Director of Public Health and in accordance with the laws of the State of Washington.


Section 2. Fluoridation equipment. The City of Redmond shall proceed to acquire, purchase, construct, install, operate and maintain in the manner provided by law all necessary and proper fluoridation equipment and supplies to carry out the provisions of this ordinance.

Section 3. Commencement of fluoridation. The fluoridation of the public water supply and system of the City of Redmond not now receiving such fluoridation treatment shall be commenced as soon as practicable after the effective date of this ordinance and the approval of the Washington State Department of Health.

Section 4. Effective date. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force five (5) days after the date of its publication in the manner provided by law.

PASSED by the Council of the City of Redmond, Washington, at a regular meeting thereof, and APPROVED by the Mayor this 18 day of February, 1975.
