ORDINANCE NO. 886

AN ORDINANCE, creating and establishing a Redmond Disability Board pursuant to RCW Chapter 41.26 in connection with uniformed law enforcement officers and fire fighters of the City: providing for the appointment, election and terms of members; and prescribing the duties and authority of the Board.

WHEREAS, State law requires each city having a population of 20,000 or more to establish a disability board to carry out the functions, powers and duties prescribed by RCW Chapter 41.26, Law Enforcement Officers' and Fire Fighters' Retirement System (LEOFF); and

WHEREAS, the City of Redmond now has a population in excess of 20,000 and the City Council has determined that a Redmond Disability Board should be established pursuant to RCW 41.26.110; Now, Therefore,

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Redmond Disability Board established - Membership. Pursuant to RCW 41.26.110, the Redmond Disability Board is hereby established, which shall consist of two members of the City Council to be appointed by the Mayor, one fire fighter to be elected by the majority vote of City fire fighters under LEOFF, one law enforcement officer to be elected by the majority vote of City law enforcement officers under LEOFF, and one citizen from the public at large residing within the City to be appointed by the four other members appointed and elected.

Section 2. Terms - Vacancies. All members of the Redmond Disability Board shall serve for a two (2) year term; provided, that for first terms, the law enforcement officer elected shall serve for a one year term, one of the Council appointees shall serve for a one year term as designated by the Mayor, and all other appointees shall serve two year terms. First terms shall commence as of November 1, 1979, and successive terms shall commence as of the 1st day of each January thereafter. Vacancies shall be filled by appointment or election for the unexpired term of the member whose death, resignation or removal creates the vacancy. A member may be removed for cause by the majority vote of the other members.


Section 3. Duties and powers of the Board - Rules and Regulations. The Board shall perform all functions, exercise all powers and make all determinations as specified in RCW Chapter 41.26 for disability boards. The Board may adopt reasonable rules and regulations to carry out its authority and to govern the manner and form of filing, presentations and hearings before the Board.

Section 4. Compensation - expenses. The members of the Board shall receive no compensation for their service upon the Board, but shall be reimbursed for all expenses incurred incidental to their services on the Board.

Section 5. Effective date. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force five (5) days after its publication in the manner provided by law.


