

An ordinance, entitled an ordinance regulating and controlling the use and occupation of the streets, sidewalks, alleys and public places within the corporate limits of the town of Redmond.

Be it ordained by the town council of the town of Redmond as follows:

Section 1: That it is hereby declared the policy of the town Council of the town of Redmond to regulate and control the streets, alleys, sidewalks and all public places within the corporate limits of the said town of Redmond, to keep the same clear from all use, occupation or obstruction by any person, firm, corporation or company except wherein it is the consensus of the town Council that any obstruction or use of said street, alley, sidewalk or public place shall not be a public nuisance or shall not interfere with the public in their proper use and legal enjoyment and use of same.

Section 2: That no person, firm, corporation or company shall obstruct or use any public street, alley, sidewalk or public place for any private use without first obtaining a permit from the town council under such terms and conditions as the town council shall order for the use, obstruction or occupation of same for any private use.

Section 3: That in the event that any person, firm, corporation or company shall attempt to use or shall use any street, alley, sidewalk or public place for any private use without first obtaining such permit from the said council, that the town Marshal shall give to such person, firm, corporation or company notice to remove the same or cease to make such private use of same, and that in the event that said firm, person, corporation or company shall fail to remove any obstruction or desist from the use of same, then in that event the town Marshal may remove or have removed such obstruction at the expense of the owner thereof, and may arrest said person, firm, corporation or company or their agent or agents for obstructing or using said street, alley, sidewalk or public place and subject the offender to a fine of not less than \$5.00 nor more than \$100.00 for each offense, and he shall stand committed until such fine is paid.

Sec.4. It shall be unlawful to park or leave any Motor Vehicle or vehicles of any kind whatsoever, on the East side of Leary street, between Cleveland street and Jackson street, during the hours between 8 O'clock A.M. and 6 O'clock P.M. excepting Sundays and Holidays.

This shall not apply to trucks while loading or unloading same, and for the period of one hour only and while attended by a person or persons. It shall be unlawful to park any Motor vehicle or any vehicle whatsoever, on the West side of said Leary street, between Cleveland street and Jackson street in any manner but angle parking, and for a period of one hour only, between 8 O'clock A.M. and 6 O'clock P.M., excepting sundays and holidays. No trucks or Motor vehicles or vehicles of any kind whatsoever having an overall length of more than 20 feet shall be permitted to park on said West side of Leary street.

Any person, firm corporation or company violating the provisions of section 4 shall be deemed guilty of misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine not to exceed \$10.00

Any person, firm, corporation or company violating any of the provisions of this ordinance and having been convicted thereof and a fine having been imposed who shall fail to pay such fine, may be sentenced to the County Jail to serve out such fine at the rate of \$5.00 per day.
